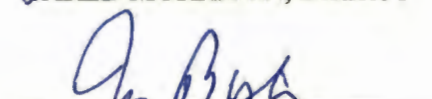

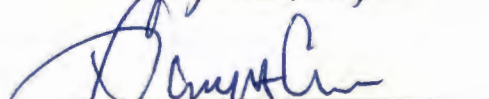

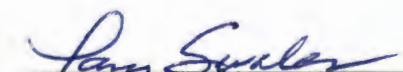

**MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT
BETWEEN THE MISSISSIPPI TRANSPORTATION COMMISSION
AND RANKIN COUNTY, MISSISSIPPI**

This agreement (the "Agreement") is made by and between the Mississippi Transportation Commission ("the Commission"), a body corporate of the State of Mississippi, acting by and through the duly authorized Executive Director of the Mississippi Department of Transportation ("MDOT"), and RANKIN COUNTY, MISSISSIPPI, a political subdivision of the State of Mississippi, (the "County") under authority granted under the provisions of Miss. Code Ann. (1972) Title 65, as amended, effective as of the date of last execution.

WHEREAS, the Commission and the County have a mutual obligation to provide a safe and efficient transportation system for the benefit of the citizens of the State of Mississippi and visitors to the central Mississippi area; and

WHEREAS, Mississippi Highway 468 and 469 provide vital access to the County and central Mississippi, and traffic counts are substantial; and

WHEREAS, traffic is expected to increase in the area around the intersection of Mississippi Highway 468 and 469 due to the anticipated growth of the area; and

WHEREAS, a proposal has been made for development of property at the intersection of these highways which could potentially impact traffic safety at or near the intersection. See Exhibit "1"; and

WHEREAS, the developer has proposed a convenience store with gas service (Phase 1). Phase 1 reflects ingress and egress at a point fronting Mississippi Highway 469. The developer has also proposed future development of the site consisting of retail space (Phase 2) with an additional means of ingress and egress depicted along the south right of way line of Mississippi Highway 468; and

WHEREAS, the parties hereto wish to allow Phase 1 of the proposed development to be initiated, as well as the means of ingress and egress depicted for Phase 1 on Exhibit "1" hereto, but with restrictions that prevent any additional development after completion of Phase 1 until such time as the traffic safety at or near the intersection is deemed by the Commission to be adequately addressed to the satisfaction of the Commission and the County; and

WHEREAS, the Commission and the County desire to enter into this agreement setting out their mutual obligations, so that Phase 1 may proceed in an expeditious manner while protecting the rights and responsibilities of the Commission and the County as it relates to proposed future development; and

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the premises and agreements of the parties as hereinafter contained, the Commission and the County mutually agree to the following:

ARTICLE I

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES FOR EACH PARTY

A. THE COMMISSION WILL:

1. Review and consider approval of the installation of means of public highway ingress and egress to Phase 1 of the proposed development as reflected on Exhibit "1" attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. The development activity contemplated herein is to be located on a parcel of property identified as Rankin County Parcel Number H06-7-20, consisting of 7.34 acres (the "Property"). Phase 1 is more particularly described as a Convenience Store with covered exterior fuel dispensing pumps (approximately 10), typical means of vehicle ingress and egress at locations deemed by the Commission to be appropriate for Phase 1, with approximately 25-30 parking spaces, lighting, and landscaping. Phase 1 of the development will be situated on the western boundary of the Property at a point nearest the intersection of Mississippi Highway 468 and Mississippi Highway 469.
2. Give consideration to the placement of an additional means of ingress and egress to the proposed development for purposes of a later developed Phase 2, which is as yet undefined and unplanned, and provide conditions and requirements that must be met by the Developer in order to secure Commission approval of said additional means of ingress and egress:
3. Issue the requisite permits allowing the developer to connect to the Commission's facilities for the purpose of developing Phase 1 of Exhibit "1."

B. THE COUNTY WILL:

1. Refrain from issuing any approvals or authorizations to the developer for additional development activity beyond that proposed as Phase 1 as reflected on Exhibit "1" until such time as the Commission has authorized and approved conditions and requirements that must be met by the developer in order to secure Commission approval of additional means of ingress and egress

ARTICLE II. GENERAL PROVISIONS

The Commission will retain the right to refuse any permit requested by the Developer to connect with any of the Commission's facilities unless the proposed improvements have been approved by the appropriate representatives of MDOT.

ARTICLE III. NOTICE & DESIGNATED AGENTS

- A. For purposes of implementing this section and all other sections of this Agreement with regard to notice, the following individuals are hereby designated as agents for the respective parties unless otherwise indentured in the addenda hereto:

- B. All notices given hereunder shall be by U.S. Certified Mail, return receipt requested, or by facsimile and shall be effective only upon receipt by the addressee at the above addresses or telephone numbers.

ARTICLE IV. RELATIONSHIP OF THE PARTIES

- A. With respect to the County's involvement in authorizing the development, the relationship of these parties to the Commission will be that of an independent contractor, and said parties, in accordance with their status as independent contractors, covenant and agree that they will conduct themselves consistent with such status, and that they and their employees will neither hold themselves out as, nor claim to be, officers or employees of the Commission or MDOT by reason hereof. The County and its employees and officials, will not, by reason hereof, make any claim, demand or application or for any right or privilege applicable to an officer or employee of the Commission, including but not limited to workers' compensation coverage, unemployment insurance benefits, social security coverage, retirement membership or credit, or any form of tax withholding whatsoever.
- B. The Commission executes all directives and orders through MDOT. The County executes all directives and orders through its County Administrator. All notices, communications, and correspondence among the Commission and the County shall be directed to the designated agents shown above in Article III.

ARTICLE V. RESPONSIBILITIES FOR CLAIMS

- A. No provision of this Agreement is intended, nor shall it be construed, to grant any right, title, or interest to any party not a signatory hereto.
- B. Any employee or official of the County, as well as any third party engaged by it, will not be construed to be an employee or agent of the Commission or MDOT. The Commission will have no authority to employ, retain, train, supervise, or discharge any such person or contractor.

ARTICLE VI. MISCELLANEOUS

No modification of this Memorandum of Agreement shall be binding unless such modification shall be in writing and signed by all parties. If any provision of this Memorandum of Understanding shall be held to be invalid or unenforceable for any reason, the remaining provisions shall continue to be valid and enforceable. If a court finds that any provision of this Memorandum of Agreement is invalid or unenforceable, but that by limiting such provision it would become valid and enforceable, then such provision shall be deemed to be written, construed, and enforced as so limited.

ARTICLE VII. TERMINATION

This Agreement may be terminated by either party for a breach of any provision hereof. Termination shall not, of itself, cancel any authorization and/or approval made in reliance upon this Agreement which had occurred prior to the time of termination.

2. A copy of the approved utility permit application and a copy of this Permit must be placed in all vehicles utilized by Applicant and/or Contractor.
3. All Utilities must be buried to a depth that provides a minimum of 5 feet of cover over the utility. Any utilities found to have been located or relocated at a shallower depth shall be relocated to the proper depth by the Applicant at Applicant's sole expense within thirty (30) days from the date upon which the applicant is notified of the violation. A ".pdf" version of as built drawings must be delivered to the Rankin County Administrator at project completion.

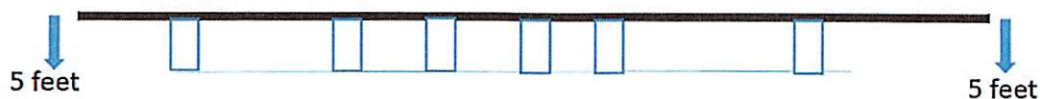

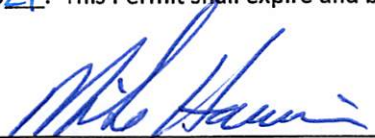
