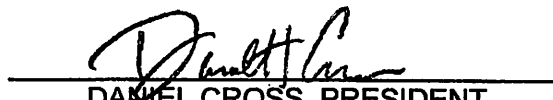
WHEREAS, the most impressive statistic compiled by the Northwest Rankin High School Girls Soccer Team is the overall team GPA which stands at 3.7.

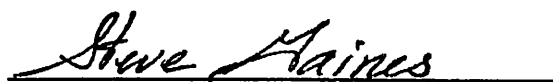

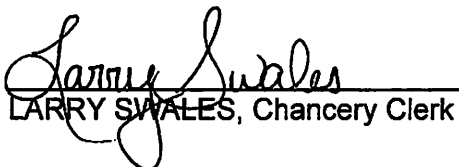

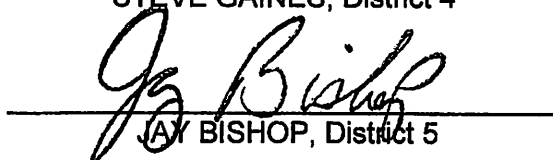

**RESOLUTION SUPPORTING ESTABLISHMENT OF PASSENGER RAIL SERVICE THROUGH
THE CENTRAL MISSISSIPPI INTERSTATE 20 CORRIDOR**

WHEREAS, Central Mississippi has a rich passenger rail history; and

WHEREAS, reconnecting central Mississippi by passenger rail from Meridian to Dallas/Fort-Worth will provide a critical transportation link connecting the state capitol in Jackson to other vibrant east/west economies along the I-20 corridor; and

WHEREAS, reconnecting passenger rail will connect Mississippi's International Airport to the Dallas/Fort-Worth International Airport; and

WHEREAS, reconnecting Central Mississippi as a passenger rail hub would link service east, west, north, and south resulting in significant economic impact to Central Mississippi that will help the region capitalize on Central Mississippi's assets; and

WHEREAS, the establishment of passenger rail will have positive economic impacts to Central Mississippi from tourism, business, healthcare, and educational connections through passenger rail as well as a multimodal connection to Dallas/Fort-Worth; and

WHEREAS, the cooperation with host railroads to bring passenger rail will have positive industrial impacts and bring more freight connectivity; and

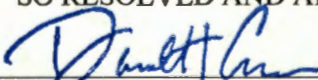
WHEREAS, the Southern Rail Commission has worked diligently and in good faith with all stakeholders, including local, regional, state, national government partners and advocates freight railroads establish passenger rail in the region; and

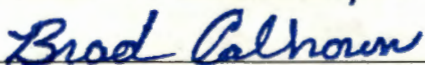

RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE MISSISSIPPI LEGISLATURE TO ENSURE THE
MISSISSIPPI AMBULANCE SYSTEM IS PRESERVED AND ADVANCED THROUGH AN
UPPER PAYMENT LIMIT PROGRAM SUFFICIENT TO MEET THE SUBSTANTIAL
DEMANDS ON OUR EMERGENCY MEDICAL SYSTEM

WHEREAS, Emergency Medical Service systems in Mississippi communities are strained and nearing a critical point in their ability to service our patient population, leaving rural Mississippians with limited or no access to paramedics' life-saving care and transportation to hospitals;

WHEREAS, the number of paramedics and emergency medical technicians are dwindling and ambulance providers are struggling to compete for those professionals who are currently being recruited by the hospitals in an unprecedented healthcare workforce crisis;

WHEREAS, the current reimbursement rates are insufficient to meet the rising financial demands on providers including competitive wages for paramedics and EMTs, fuel cost increases, supply chain challenges, and inflated costs of life-saving equipment;

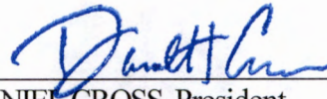
WHEREAS, the Upper Payment Limit program for ambulance providers is not a cost to the state or local governments and is a mechanism whereby the providers and the federal government can provide funding to safeguard our ambulance system and preserve access to life-saving services for rural Mississippians;

WHEREAS, absent a meaningful Upper Payment Limit program sufficient to meet the substantial demands on the ambulance system, local governments will be forced to provide increased subsidies to providers to off-set these costs and to ensure shorter response times,

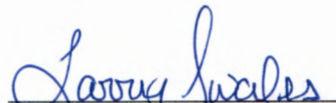

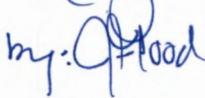

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING CHANGE IN POLLING PLACE LOCATIONS

WHEREAS, the Rankin County Board of Supervisors is responsible for providing safe, secure, and usable locations as polling places within Rankin County, Mississippi; and

WHEREAS, from time to time the Rankin County Board of Supervisors and/or the Rankin County Election Commission is notified that certain polling places will no longer be available for use as a polling place; and

WHEREAS, the Rankin County Board of Supervisors has been notified that replacement polling places must be identified, evaluated, inspected and secured so that normal voting activity is unimpeded; and

WHEREAS, the following four (4) existing polling place locations will no longer be available to serve as polling places for local, state or federal elections:

- (1) 118 West Steen – Florence Fire Department, 112 Deweese Street, Florence, MS
- (2) 312 Dry Creek – McLaurin High School, 130 Tiger Drive, Star, MS
- (3) 323 Greenfield – Monterey Fire Department #2, 3954, Hwy. 468 West, Pearl, MS
- (4) 416 East Crossgates – Crossgates Baptist Church, 8 Crosswoods Road, Brandon, MS

WHEREAS, as an additional consideration, it has been determined that two precincts should be consolidated into one precinct (514 North McLaurin and 515 South McLaurin) and the polling place for North McLaurin (Pearl Chamber of Commerce) shall no longer be necessary to serve as a polling place; and

WHEREAS, the Rankin County Board of Supervisors has determined that there are adequate alternative polling place locations that are spacious enough to accommodate the number of expected voters and poll workers, meet the requisite Americans with Disabilities Act requirements to serve as a polling location, have adequate parking and are otherwise acceptable alternate locations; and

WHEREAS, the alternate polling place locations listed below are well known in the community, are in close proximity to the prior polling locations and have been situated in their current locations for many years;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Rankin County Board of Supervisors that the polling place locations identified above **shall be re-located to the facilities listed as follows:**

- (1) 118 West Steen - Marvin United Methodist Church, 211 North Church Street, Florence, MS
- (2) 312 Dry Creek - Jerusalem MB Church Fellowship Hall, 446 Jerusalem Church Rd., Brandon, MS
- (3) 323 Greenfield - Bethel Baptist Church, 128 Bethel Church Rd., Brandon, MS
- (4) 416 East Crossgates - First United Pentecostal Church, 1368 W. Government St., Brandon, MS

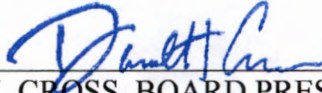
BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Rankin County Board of Supervisors that Precinct 514 North McLaurin and Precinct 515 South McLaurin shall be consolidated and the new precinct shall be named by issued an identification name and number by either the Rankin County Election Commission or the Rankin County Circuit Clerk, and that the newly consolidated Precinct shall have one polling

place location, which shall be McLaurin Heights Methodist Church, 325 Mary Ann Drive, Pearl, Mississippi;

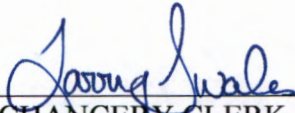
