CONTRACT FOR SERVICES

This CONTRACT FOR SERVICES is made and entered into this the 28 day of July, 2022, by and between the Rankin County Board of Supervisors and the Rankin County Chancery Clerk for services related to the adoption of the Redistricting Plan adopted by the Rankin County Board of Supervisors in December 2021.

WHEREAS, the Rankin County Board of Supervisors desires to secure and maintain the services of the Rankin County Circuit Clerk to aid the county in its efforts to provide for redistricting in accordance with federal and state law. Pursuant to Miss. Code Ann. Section 23-15-225(2), the Clerk desires to enter into this agreement to perform duties necessary to implement the 2020 Redistricting Plan adopted by the Board.

WHEREAS, if a county changes the boundaries for district offices, among other actions, the registrar is required to modify voter registration records to reflect the changes and to conduct other and further activities necessitated thereby.

WHEREAS, Miss. Code Ann. Section 23-15-225 provides that registrars in counties having a population of greater than 100,000 and less than \$200,000, may receive not to exceed \$25,300 in compensation for said services.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises herein contained, the parties agree as follows:

1. The Board of Supervisors hereby contracts with the Rankin county Circuit Clerk for a term commencing July 28, 2022, until December 31, 2022, unless sooner terminated or unless extended by agreement of the parties pursuant to Miss. Code Ann. Section 23-15-225. The Clerk accepts the terms and conditions hereof and will perform the services contemplated herein.
2. The Clerk will take all actions necessary and required of a registrar to conform all voter registration and other voter related information to all boundary changes that have resulted from actions of the state legislature or Board of Supervisors or the Rankin County School Board and to make all required notifications to affected voters and to issue all reports to, and to do all other things required by, the Mississippi Secretary of State.
3. The Clerk will secure a legal description and map of the map reflecting the changed boundaries for all congressional, state and local districts caused by the Redistricting Plan and shall provide a street-based index with directions of streets and locations of odd and even addresses.

4. The Board of Supervisors will provide the Clerk notice of any precinct boundary changes by September 1, 2022.
5. The Board of Supervisors will pay the Clerk the sum of \$25,000 for all services on or before the 28 day of July, 2022.
6. This contract is binding on the parties and will inure to the benefit of any successors as authorized by state or federal law.
7. This agreement is governed by the laws of the State of Mississippi.
8. Nothing contained in this Contract shall be construed to constitute an employment relationship or agency relationship between the Board of Supervisors and the Circuit Clerk.
9. This contract contains the entire agreement between the parties and may not be altered, amended, or terminated except by written agreement between the parties.

**RESOLUTION APPROVING A CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT FOR LEONARD
BUSBY, 1307 OLD FANNIN RD, BRANDON, MS 39047**

WHEREAS, Leonard Busby, Busby Companies did file a petition for a conditional use permit to place a billboard in the northwest corner, inside of the fence, of the Farmers Market at 1307 Old Fannin Rd, Brandon, MS 39047; and

WHEREAS, all notice requirements of the Zoning Ordinance of Rankin County were accomplished and a public hearing was held on July 28, 2022, as required; and,

WHEREAS, The Planning Commission upon conclusion of the scheduled meeting on April 28, 2022, adopted a motion authorizing the Planning Staff to publish notice of public hearing for the request to place a billboard in the northwest corner, inside of the fence, of the Farmers Market at 1307 Old Fannin Rd, Brandon, MS 39047;

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Rankin County, Mississippi, have the final authority with regard to all matters involving the Zoning Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors are fully familiar with the request and the area involved in the request; and

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of Rankin County, Mississippi that the request to place a billboard in the northwest corner, inside of the fence, of the Farmers Market at 1307 Old Fannin Rd, Brandon, MS 39047; is hereby granted and such action is taken pursuant to the findings of fact set out as follows:

1. The Board of Supervisors of Rankin County, Mississippi, have the final authority with regard to all matters involving the Zoning Ordinance.
2. The recommendation of the Planning Commission is advisory in nature.
3. The Board of Supervisors used their common knowledge and familiarity with the subject property and the surrounding neighborhood in determining its findings contained in this order.
4. This action will promote the general welfare of Rankin County and will not adversely affect adjacent property. Future projects within the designated area will remain subject to the Zoning Ordinance and approval of site plans or other matter will allow the County to continue to monitor the area.
5. The granting of this action does not relieve this request from compliance with any applicable law, court order, covenants, or contracts.
6. The conditional use permit is approved with the following conditions:

- Conditional Use Permit cannot be officially assigned without Board's authorization
- County will be allowed to have public safety and community messages of at least 720 flips per day (Silver Package)

BETWEEN CITY OF FLOWOOD, MISSISSIPPI, AND RANKIN COUNTY,
MISSISSIPPI, UTILIZING PROCEEDS APPROPRIATED BY THE MISSISSIPPI
LEGISLATURE IN HOUSE BILL 1353 DURING THE 2022 LEGISLATIVE SESSION**

THIS MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (this “MOU”) is made and entered into on the dates reflected herein by and between Rankin County, Mississippi, a political subdivision of the State of Mississippi acting by and through its Board of Supervisors (the “County”), and the City of Flowood, Mississippi (the “City”), a municipal corporation located in the State of Mississippi acting by and through its Mayor and Board of Aldermen (the “City”).

RECITALS AND AGREEMENT:

- A. The County is authorized to construct and maintain roads and streets within any municipality of the County. Mississippi Code Annotated §65-7-85, §65-7-74 and §19-3-40. Also see Mississippi Attorney General Opinion No. 2011-00067 (Adams – March 3, 2011). The City is authorized to construct and maintain roads, streets and sidewalks within its municipal boundaries. Mississippi Code Annotated §21-37-3.
- B. The City is located wholly within the boundaries of the County.
- C. The County and City desire to work together to carry out the statutory obligations set forth in paragraph A. The cooperative actions contemplated herein will benefit the residents of the County and the City.
- D. The County agrees to provide to City a portion of funds totaling \$1,000,000 appropriated to County by the Mississippi Legislature in House Bill 1353 which was passed and adopted during the 2022 Legislative Session.
- E. The City shall be solely responsible for ensuring that all work is performed in accordance with the prescribed uses set forth in House Bill 1353. The City will be responsible for compliance with all requirements set forth in Miss. Code Ann. Section 31-7-13, et seq. in the use of the funds.
- F. This MOU shall be effective from and after the last date of execution below and shall continue in effect until such time as the funds have been disbursed for the purposes set forth herein.
- G. Any notice, consent or other communication in connection with this MOU shall be in writing and may be delivered in person, by mail or by email. If hand-delivered, the notice shall be effective upon delivery. If by email, the notice shall be effective when sent. If served by mail, the notice shall be effective three (3) business days after being deposited in the United States Postal Service by certified mail, return receipt requested, addressed appropriately to the intended recipient as follows:

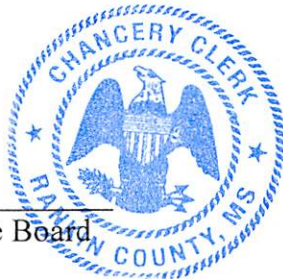

BOARD ORDER AUTHORIZING PROFESSIONAL SERVICES
NECESSARY TO ADVANCE RANKIN COUNTY'S
WATERSHED PROTECTION AND RESTORATION PROGRAM
FOR PURPOSES OF POSITIONING THE PROGRAM TO ACHIEVE
FULL ONE TO ONE MATCHING PURSUANT TO THE
MISSISSIPPI MUNICIPALITY AND COUNTY WATER INFRASTRUCTURE
GRANT PROGRAM ACT OF 2022
(SENATE BILL 2822)

WHEREAS, Rankin County through its Board of Supervisors adopted its County-wide Storm Water Management Program (the "Program") in 2018; and,

WHEREAS, Rankin County is the recipient of American Rescue Plan Act funds appropriated by the federal government directly to Rankin County and has determined that a significant portion of said funds should be used to implement the Program, with an emphasis on that portion of the Program that is described as the Watershed Protection and Restoration Program (the "ARPA-Related Program"); and

WHEREAS, the Mississippi Legislature adopted and passed Senate Bill 2822, the Mississippi Municipality and County Water Infrastructure Grant Program Act of 2022 wherein the State Legislature created a competitive grant program whereby qualifying political subdivisions and quasi-political subdivisions are able to submit applications for one to one state matching funds pursuant to grant application regulations promulgated by the Mississippi Department of Environmental Quality ("MDEQ"); and

WHEREAS, in recognition of the competitive nature of MDEQ's grant application process, the Rankin County Board of Supervisors desires for its ARPA-Related Program to be presented for one to one matching funds in a manner that reflects, as much as possible, that level of planning, preparation, completeness and compliance that best positions the County's ARPA-Related Program for maximum one to one funding; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors is aware that significant professional services are required to accomplish the goal of acquiring maximum one to one state matching funding and desires to authorize the initiation of all necessary professional services required to achieve maximum one to one state matching funding;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDERED by the Rankin County Board of Supervisors:

1. All professional services, whether those performed by professionals retained via a procurement process or otherwise, including but not limited to legal services, engineering services, program management services, or otherwise, are authorized to proceed in accordance with the terms of all professional services agreements now or hereafter adopted and approved by the Board of Supervisors with respect to each and every aspect of the County's ARPA-Related Program;
2. The County Administrator and/or the President of the Board of Supervisors are authorized to execute all documents and sign all required agreements, task orders, project initiation

documents, or otherwise, necessary to carry out the intention of this Board Order without limitation.

BOARD ORDER AUTHORIZING ACTIVATION OF I-20 CONNECTOR LOOP
TO INCLUDE EACH OF THE FOUR RECOGNIZED SEGMENTS THEREOF AND TO
AUTHORIZE PUBLICATION OF ALL REQUIRED PUBLIC NOTICES

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors has played an integral part in maintaining the momentum for the continuation of two federally authorized transportation initiatives in Rankin County, Mississippi (East Metro Parkway and East Brandon Bypass); and

WHEREAS, the separate projects are now recognized as the I-20 Connector Loop; and

WHEREAS, the I-20 Connector Loop has four segments (Grade Separation, Highway 18 4-Lane from Marquette Road to Star Road, Highway 18 4-Lane from Star Road to Louis Wilson Drive, East Loop); and

WHEREAS, it is necessary that one or more segments of the I-20 Connector Loop be activated and that the required public notices be published in accordance with applicable regulations.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDERED by the Rankin County Board of Supervisors:

The Board President, County Administrator, or his designee shall cause written notification to be made to all appropriate parties that activation of the segments of the I-20 Connector Loop is requested and that said requests shall be made in accordance with the timing and instructions of professionals retained by Rankin County to assist with the I-20 Connector Loop project; and

The Board President, County Administrator or his designee shall cause publication of all required public notices associated with the I-20 Connector Loop Project or any segment thereof, and that said notices shall be published in accordance with the regulations applicable to the I-20 Connector Loop or any segment thereof.
